Bill Wiggins opened the meeting at 6:15 and gave the Devotion. February meeting Minutes were approved via email and submitted for Epistle publication.



Property: Toni Hadden reported that Richard Wolf has been in contact with City of Savannah regarding curbing repair. Repairs to begin in April. Gym has additional new roof leaks. Repair is scheduled with RPI. Church leaks are due to flashing issues which will be addressed in the summer. Defibrillator for Gym is on backorder and medical supplies for gym have been received.

Old Business: Also reported was the status of the Savannah LGBTQ request for parking lot use. A Contract has been submitted by Rebecca McClain to Savannah LGBTQ. Requirements listed in contract are due to church's liability issues.

New Business:

Bill distributed Church's Constitution for Council to review current listed committee requirements.

Concern was expressed that Pastor is not always notified when a member requires attention by Pastor due to illness, hospitalization, etc. If a member knows of another member in need of attention, please let Pastor know. Birthday cards and cookies for 80+ year old birthdays are currently handled.

Pastor suggested organizing a committee to reach out to visitors to encourage continued attendance.

WELCA is presently in the second month of Safe Shelter support. Next month WELCA will start a campaign to support the Old Savannah Mission. Through March St. Paul's food pantry has supported over 120 weeks of food for families at the Savannah Summit Apartments. This support is ongoing at 20 weeks of food per month so congregation might need reminding as donations have trended down lately.

Christian Flathman announced that his daughter will need volunteer hours for school and organizing a campaign for more food for the pantry would be a good opportunity for Youth to satisfy the need for hours.

Bill and several other members visited Safe Shelter for a tour. Grants and funding provide about 50% support for the shelter and the remaining comes from private donors, organizations, and churches like ours. Average family is at Safe Shelter for approx. 90 days.

Safe Shelter offers a 9-week program during the summer for kids at the Shelter. Bill requested that St. Paul's set-up a one-day program at UGA Marine Education Center and Aquarium on Skidway Island. Staff at aquarium would provide tours and possibly St. Paul's could provide lunch for the kids.
