Minutes continued

Treasurer: Bank balance of \$19,617.70 is in checking for operations and \$35,000 in savings. No monies were moved for expenses in October due to two monetary gifts given. Online giving began November 5th with a light participation. SCAD is continuing their quarterly rent payments for the use of the gym. Other renters include Veritas Academy, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) and a local fencing club.

Day Care balances: operation account balance \$24,000; savings balance \$84,000, Students enrolled to date total 65-70. Day Care still ranks 3^{rd} or 4^{th} in the city in terms of reputation.

Donald is still awaiting quotes from a local commercial insurance broker to find coverage due to Church Mutual cancelling our policy. Quotes to date have come in less than expected but higher than previous premium to Church Mutual. Expects to have final quotes by mid-December.

Lisa Neville questioned if publishing Memorial gifts to the church in the Epistle might generate more giving. Donald was not sure why the donor publications were stopped but will coordinate with Fran and Betsy to possibly resume the publishing.

Property: Andy Foose thanked all who participated in "Congregation" workday. Bill & George Wiggins pressure washed lane side of church. Other minor repairs throughout the property were handled by Pastor, Andy & Erin Foose, Billy Sparks, Richard Wolf, and Lisa & Ricky Neville. Hopes are to schedule another workday in the Spring. Richard Wolf obtained a bid of \$19,000 to refinish the wood exterior doors of the church. Richard and Donald will explore other options such as refinishing the 31st Street doors and replacing the other doors with steel doors. The courtyard gate has been constructed and will replace old gate in the next few weeks.

Social Ministry: See Bulletin or Epistle for the times and dates for Caroling, Family Advent Evening, and Christmas Eve Services. There are many great opportunities which are scheduled in December.

Old Business: Covered in previous reports above.

New Business: Council nominees presented to replace outgoing members Pat Sparks, Mickie Wadhauer, and Toni Hadden are Kim Screen, Richard Wolf, and Joey Barnard. Motion was made and seconded to accept this slate of nominees. Motion passed. These nominees will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting November 19th.

Thanksgiving gift bag delivery will be delayed until November 26^h.

September meeting Minutes were approved via email and submitted for Epistle publication.

Pastor's Report: Report attached. Highlights include Pastors Meeting, visitations in homes, hospitals, and nursing homes, Confirmation will resume on Sundays at 9:45am in the Chapel with Zoe Shinall is our only student. Bible Study will continue through week prior to Thanksgiving. No Bible Study in December as Advent Service will be held on Wednesdays. Donald is awaiting quotes from a local commercial insurance broker to find coverage due to Church Mutual cancelling our policy. Quotes are expected to be high due to our location, the Trolley Car Historic District, and our facilities.

Property: Andy Foose has set Saturday, November 4th as "Congregation" workday to handle minor repairs throughout the property. The cause of Ladies Room in Hoffner Hall leaks were discovered to be the rusting hood vent in kitchen. The water came in the hood area and traveled the rafter to ladies' room. The courtyard gate is scheduled for repair. All exterior doors at Hoffner Hall have been replaced courtesy of John Shealey with shatterproof glass. Herman Grotheer has offered to have the wood exterior doors of the church refinished in memory of his father.

Social Ministry: Bill reported that 110 have signed up for meals of hot dogs and hamburgers while the day care has Trunk or Treat in the church parking lot.

Old Business: Covered in previous reports above.

New Business: Thanksgiving gift bags will be assembled after Thanksgiving lunch on November 19th.
